	For Hurricane Sandy relief and administration of the program

	Approximately \$100,000
4.	What services has your organization provided to those affected by Hurricane Sandy? What populations or geographical areas are being served by your organization in response to Hurricane Sandy? What services does it expect to provide in the future?
	To date, All Hands Volunteers has provided free muck, gut, and debris removal services to over 150 families through the in field management and coordination of over 1200 volunteers. The estimated value of this service is roughly \$225,000. We have provided these free services to affected communities on Staten Island, Long Beach, Island Park, and Freeport, NY. Looking ahead, All Hands will continue to provide muck and gut services on an as needed basis and have begun to ramp up a mold treatment program that will also be provided free of charge to homeowners in the same geographic areas and beyond as resources permit.
