	<p>Information provided in the prior response remains accurate, with additional Habitat Affiliates having moved from “muck out” and other emergency assistance work to interior reconstruction work (sheetrock, insulation, cabinets and systems as needed, etc.). Habitat Affiliates have also been engaged in discussions with funders and have been developing construction plans for the balance of 2013.</p> <p>Additional detail regarding New York City work performed by Habitat Affiliates is as follows:</p> <p>In New York City, Habitat for Humanity's response has been led by Habitat for Humanity New York City (HFH-NYC) in Staten Island and Habitat for Humanity Westchester (HFH-Westchester) in the Rockaways. Both HFH-NYC and HFH-Westchester responded immediately after the storm and have been working continuously</p>												

	<p>to address unmet needs of families, community centers, churches and businesses devastated by the storm. This work has been done in collaboration with volunteers, corporate partners and community partners. On Staten Island, HFH-NYC has: mobilized approximately 450 volunteers; mucked out more than fifty homes and helped to repair community centers and churches. In the Rockaways, HFH Westchester has: mobilized approximately 5,500 volunteers, mucked out 250-300 houses; delivered sheetrock and insulation to 100 homes; helped 10 businesses reopen, through assistance with mucking, gutting and cleaning; sheet-rocked one church and is in the process of sheet-rocking another church; currently in final stages of "minor" and "medium" repair work for 10 houses; in planning stages for "minor" and "medium" repair work for another 10 houses.</p>

We anticipate that Sandy relief will take place ongoing as a function of our traditional housing program and volunteer engagement activities in the geographic areas impacted by the storm.</p> <p>Sandy relief activities will be conducted by Habitat Affiliates, with support provided by HFHI.</p>
