**Hurricane Sandy Relief Information**

**Name of Organization:** NATIONAL URBAN LEAGUE

1.	<p>What is the approximate dollar amount of donations and pledges that your organization has received to date in response to Hurricane Sandy?</p> <p>\$50,000 grant from Freddie Mac for National Urban League general Hurricane Sandy-related expenses (we were barred from our building from 10/30 to 11/19). \$25,000 received from Bank of America for Sandy Victims \$12,080 raised on NUL's website between 11/13/12 and 1/18/13 Total: \$87,080</p>
2.	<p>Will these funds be used solely for Hurricane Sandy relief? If not, approximately what portion will be used for Hurricane Sandy relief and what other purposes will funds be used for?</p> <p>Yes.</p>
3.	<p>Approximately how much has your organization spent to date on Hurricane Sandy relief?</p> <p>\$11,000 in direct expenses and \$50,000 for National Urban League general Hurricane Sandy-related expenses (we were barred from our building from 10/30 to 11/19). In addition, \$22,760 of in-kind expenses were incurred (see below).</p>
4.	<p>What services has your organization provided to those affected by Hurricane Sandy? What populations or geographical areas are being served by your organization in response to Hurricane Sandy? What services does it expect to provide in the future?</p> <p>Approximately 20-25 Urban League staff members and Walgreens distributed emergency supplies on Monday, Nov. 12, to Coney Island residents. On Friday, November 16<sup>th</sup>, staff attended volunteering activities in Long Island in conjunction with the Urban League Long Island Affiliate.</p> <p>The National Urban League adopted two families after the aftermath of Hurricane Sandy. Pastor Dennis Loncke lost his home and his church and was awarded a check for \$5000.</p> <p>Doris Finch's home was infested with mold. The National Urban League found her temporary housing and paid \$6000 for a three month rental while her home was being repaired.</p>
5.	<p>Has your organization provided funding to other organizations for Hurricane Sandy relief efforts? If so, which organizations have received those funds and what is the approximate dollar amount provided to them? How does your organization determine the need for funding?</p>

Our new initiative is to assist five severely damage churches by offering a rebuilding grant of \$5000. The selection process will be underway during the months of May and June. Empire Baptist State Convention of New York is a coalition of churches and community organizations. They will be providing a preselected list of churches affected by devastation. The final review/selections will be decided by the internal NUL Hurricane Sandy Relief Committee.

6. Has your organization provided, or does it intend to provide, direct financial assistance to individuals, families or businesses for Hurricane Sandy relief? If so, what is the approximate dollar amount that your organization has provided to date and approximately how much direct financial assistance does it expect to provide in the future? How does your organization determine the need for assistance?

See item 4. East Brooklyn Congregation is a coalition of churches and community organizations. It preselected a list of individuals affected by Sandy devastation. The National Urban League's Hurricane Sandy Relief committee reviewed each case and made the final decision.

7. Does your organization have a plan in place on how to use any surplus funds not spent for Hurricane Sandy relief? If so, please describe that plan.
