	\$5,337.53 total to the Sandy Responder Relief Fund \$265.00 (4 donations) from New York Residents

	\$3,268.33
4.	What services has your organization provided to those affected by Hurricane Sandy? What populations or geographical areas are being served by your organization in response to Hurricane Sandy? What services does it expect to provide in the future?
	NFE worked with Broad Channel Volunteer Fire Department, Rockaway Point Volunteer Fire Department, Breezy Point Volunteer Fire Department, West Hamilton Breach Volunteer Fire Department.  -Distributed new radio equipment (\$125,000 value, in kind) -2 fire engines (\$25,000 value plus \$6,000 shipping, in kind) -Firefighting tools and equipment (\$25,000-\$35,000 in kind) -Medical equipment and cleanup supplies (\$20,000 value, in kind) -Mobilized Towing company from Illinois with 1 flat bed and 1 tow truck to assist in delivery, station cleanup, mechanical assistance, towing firefighters vehicles. Spent 1 week on the ground. -Mobilized crew from Michigan to transport medical, firefighting, cleanup equipment and assist in fire station rehab.

5.	Has your organization provided funding to other organizations for Hurricane Sandy relief efforts? If so, which organizations have received those funds and what is the approximate dollar amount provided to them? How does your organization determine the need for funding?
	<p>To date we have worked with volunteer fire departments affected by the storm. We have and continue to organize equipment needs for the departments and donations/delivery of that equipment. Our organization has visited the area to meet with the chief officers to assess the damage and need.</p>
