DESCRIPTION OF EFFORTS

Please describe the types of assistance that your organization has provided to those affected by Hurricane Sandy.

UJA-Federation of New York has provided funding for Superstorm Sandy relief from funds contributed by donors (approximately \$6.5 million) and from a special allocation from its endowment (\$10 million). More than the entire amount contributed by donors — approximately \$13.9 million — has been expended to date. Grants totaling approximately \$1.3 million are expected to be awarded shortly, and the balance will be used to support long-term recovery and/or resiliency programs that benefit individual or institutional victims of the storm.

UJA-Federation provided funding to organizations addressing immediate needs in Zone A and the South Shore of Long Island, where damage was most severe. The Zone A communities include Staten Island, Southern Brooklyn, Lower Manhattan, and the Rockaways and Belle Harbor. Funding was granted to organizations that provided emergency food, temporary housing, financial counseling, legal services related to FEMA applications, case management, volunteer coordination and other crisis-oriented services for people impacted by the storm. UJA-Federation did not provide direct grants to individuals; instead, it made grants to organizations that provided direct cash or tuition assistance to individuals and families. These organizations were required to use eligibility forms to document need, including prior application to FEMA. Grants to Jewish day schools to provide tuition assistance for students required a similar application process with specific guidelines for eligibility. In a few cases, grants were made to organizations outside of Zone A to provide resources or assistance with temporary relocation to residents of Zone A.

UJA-Federation's funding for immediate storm relief and recovery fell into a number of categories:

- ò Grants to organizations that provided case management and legal services to storm victims.
 - ò Grants to organizations that provided cash assistance to residents of impacted areas for needs such as clothing, mortgage or rent payments, home repairs, transportation, appliances, auto repairs, furniture, bedding, and laundry. For example, UJA-Federation provided a grant to the Barry and Florence Friedberg JCC (located in Oceanside and Long Beach) to provide funds for furniture replacement for 98 individuals who suffered furniture damage due to the storm.
 - ò Grants to Jewish day schools to enable them to provide tuition assistance for students from families who lived in Zone A and on the South Shore of Long Island, and whose financial ability to meet tuition commitments was severely impacted due to the storm.
 - ò Grants to synagogues and Jewish day schools whose property was severely damaged by the storm, for temporary costs associated with relocation. For example, UJA-Federation granted Temple Beth El in Rockaway Park \$22,000 for costs for a temporary trailer to enable them to continue hold services.
 - ò Grants to IsraAID and Nechama to coordinate volunteers and resources to clean and sanitize homes and synagogues in affected areas.
 - ò Grants for Jewish day school tuition subsidies and Jewish residential summer camp subsidies for families impacted by the storm.
 - ò Funding for disaster relief coordination through the Mayor's Fund to Advance New York City.
 - ò Grants made in the early days after the storm to institutions located in Zone A or the South Shore of Long Island: \$36,000 each to UJA-Federation network agencies for general relief costs; \$5,000 each to synagogues to directly assist their congregants who were impacted by the storm; and varying amounts to Jewish day schools to directly assist educators who were impacted financially by the storm.
- In fall 2013, UJA-Federation allocated funds to provide trauma education to leadership and staff at community-based institutions in Sandy-affected areas and to pay for the provision of direct mental health/spiritual care services to impacted individuals through at least the end of June 2014. The remaining funds will be allocated principally (i) to reimburse UJA-Federation network agencies for a portion of their flood damage not covered by insurance and (ii) to support long-term recovery and/or resiliency programs that benefit individual or institutional victims of the storm.
