What is your organization's plan for using any remaining funds not spent for Hurricane Sandy relief?	As we progress further into recovery - our grantees will be able to make requests for additional funds for recovery efforts. Funds are needed in the long term - in this event - we anticipated a 5-8 year recovery period based on past experience. We also are aware that most organizations expend their funds in the beginning of the recovery and fail to plan for expenses towards the end leaving many survivors without any avenue for recovery.
